

## Candidate Statement

My name is Andrew Kingsbury and I am a first-year student at Cornell Law School. I hope to serve as Vice Chair for the American Bar Association's Law Student Division. Before law school, I attended Arizona State University. During My final year of study I split time between my studies and three companies, working 50 hours a week. I worked for Daisy Pharma, a startup focused on creating responsible pain management products in the wake of the opioid epidemic. There, I worked with company leadership to help navigate FDA regulations in order to find a streamlined process for bringing a new drug to market. Additionally, I researched how the opioid epidemic impacted local Arizona communities as well as the nation as a whole. At Uber I worked on a variety of projects using analytical software like SQL to uncover emerging fraud trends. Lastly, at Vitalyze, I worked with the CEO and two other business associates to help structure an investment proposal in order to generate over one million dollars in the first round of venture funding.
